here's an important late development in the Kau Yi Chau Artificial Islands project: the Civil Engineering and Development Department is to hold briefings on the preliminary proposals. The HKIS will follow up: stay tuned! (More on issues with the islands and other projects below.)

And now: Kung Hei Fat Choi!

May the Year of the Rabbit bring us prosperity and happiness. I am delighted to report that it has been a busy start to 2023 since the gradual relaxation of COVID-19 restrictions announced this month. These are all good signs that I feel strongly symbolise a great year ahead for the Institute, certainly promising for pursuing one of the main focuses for the year, outlined in the items for action last month: promoting our profession.

### Plumb job for a new committee to promote surveying

We have a new team dedicated to raising the profile of surveying and the HKIS in the community. The 14-member Promotion Committee, with two members from each Division and the YSG, was planned to be set up during the Annual Retreat on 7 January. It has a continuing and long-term remit to build our public exposure. But now it needs a chairman – who will be appointed soon!

Apart from building our professional image,

we discussed the adoption of uniform promotional materials by the committee for our representatives to use when they are about in the community talking about our profession. While this information will be generated by each Division, it will contain core elements to give a consistency to what we say, show and do, and for the public to grasp, when we deliver our message on different occasions.

We envision a chairman whose expertise garnered over their life's work will lead our members with a clear vision of promoting the surveying profession. This vision includes not only what materials are needed to deliver our message but also the ability to make trade terms easy to understand without over simplifying them.

### **Exchange of views with other professional institutes**

The HKIS hosted the first Joint Institutes Dinner for 2023 on 18 January. This quarterly event made a welcome return at the end of last year. Twenty representatives, including the five serving Institute Presidents of the Architectural, Surveying, Planning and Landscape subsector and the Hong Kong Institution of Engineers, sat down and exchanged their thoughts on government policies and how to best support and express views to the Government. This time key topics covered included the Artificial Islands in the Central Waters, the shortage of professionals for coming developments and the need for an overall masterplan for planning and infrastructure projects.

The five Institutes agreed to support the Kau Yi Chau Artificial Islands project and will provide a joint response to the Government upon reviewing its next announcement. Moreover, we raised our concerns about manpower and that it has to correspond with the Government's plan for the coming development. An overall

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masterplan for planning and infrastructure projects should be provided by the Government to allow practitioners the time to plan and arrange labour and resources to fit in seamlessly with projects.

The dinner proved productive and I was happy to see how well we cooperated, especially on views for the Government. The next dinner is scheduled in April and is to be arranged by the Hong Kong Institute of Architects.

### Close communications with China Liaison Office

An informal discussion with the China Liaison Office was held on 13 January. The officials expressed interest in the HKIS and asked about the kind of assistance our members might need to set up business in the Mainland, especially in the Greater Bay Area. The hour-long, face-to-face meeting came at the right time as China reopens its borders after relaxing its pandemic restrictions and welcomes the return of Hongkongers.

Hence, the Institute expects to visit various local Mainland units and authorities this year to better understand changes and developments that have happened over the past few years. Likewise, the course on China national affairs and the YSG study tour assisted by the China Liaison Office are also to resume.

### **Putting surveying first**

On 17 January, I attended the 2023-24 Budget Consultation Session: Construction and Engineering Sector, and welcomed the Government's decisive attitude to increase the supply of land. With Hong Kong's overall construction volume forecast to reach \$300 billion a year, it is vital the Government supports the construction industry with facilities and ensures there are enough professionals to drive

projects now and in the future—including surveyors, architects and engineers—through, for instance, policies to increase the university intake for architecture, surveying and engineering, which are less research-oriented, or to allocate resources or subsidies for non-University Grants Committee-subsidised surveying courses organised by bodies like the Technology and Higher Education Institute, THEi.

During the consultation, I also raised the importance of preventing brain drain. One key to ensuring we retain talent is for the volume of projects to be consistent, certainly without the extreme fluctuations that would drive professionals away when there is not enough work. The Government should create the best conditions in Hong Kong so our young generation can feel confident in embarking on long careers here.

Moreover, I gave my views and concerns about the promotion of surveying to two local newspapers and the articles (which can be downloaded from the QR codes below) appeared early this month. In the Hong Kong Economic Times, I focused on the need to elevate our profession's profile and also on giving back to the community through our providing counsel and advice. In the Singtao Daily, I touched on the continuing headache of the shortage in surveying professionals, especially for large-scale infrastructure projects, like the Northern Metropolis Development Strategy, that will spur demand for surveyors.

### PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE 會長的話

特洲人工島項目有重要進展:因應初步發展建議,土木工程拓展署將會舉行簡報會。香港測量師學會將跟進,詳情稍後公布,敬請密切留意。(有關人工島和其他項目的內容詳見下文。)

適逢農曆新年,我謹在此向一眾學會同仁送上 至誠的祝福。恭喜發財!

期望大家兔年快樂,身體健康。我欣然向大家報告,自本月宣佈逐步放寬新冠疫情限制措施以來,學會於2023年以充實方式開展工作。這些都是良好跡象,而我深信這象徵著學會將會迎來美好的一年,有望實現今年的重點工作之一一促進測量行業發展,這在上一期匯報未來一年行動計劃中亦有所概述。

### 設立全新委員會 促進測量行業發展

我們設立了全新團隊,專門負責提升測量行業和香港測量師學會在社區的形象。學會早前在1月7日的周年退修會期間計劃成立由14名成員組成的推廣委員會,各個專業組別和青年組均需指派兩名成員代表加入其中。此委員會肩負著一項持續且長期的任務,以提升學會與公眾的接觸。委員會主席將於稍後任命。

除了建立專業形象之外,我們亦同意委員會採用統一宣傳品,供學會代表在社區推廣測量業時使用。當中的資訊固然將由每個專業組別各自構思設計,但需包含核心要素,使我們在不同場合傳達訊息的言辭、展示模式和實行方法保持一致,以便公眾理解。

我們展望,委員會主席具備多年經驗和專業知識,並抱有促進測量行業的清晰願景,帶領學會成員推廣測量專業。要實現這一願景,不僅需要整合材料以傳遞學會訊息,亦需要有能力使行業術語易於理解,而又不過於簡化。

### 與其他專業機構交流意見

香港測量師學會於 1 月 18 日舉辦了 2023 年首場聯會晚宴。此季度活動在去年年底得以復辦。當晚共二十位代表包括建築、測量、規劃及園境界學會以及香港工程師學會五位在任會長等聚首一堂,就政府政策交流意見,並討論如何充分支持政府以及向其表達意見。是次晚宴涵蓋的焦點主題包括中部水域人工島、未來工程發展引致專業人員短缺,以及計劃和基建項目整體藍圖的必要性。

五個學會同意支持交椅洲人工島項目,並將在審閱下一次公告後向政府作出聯合回應。此外,我們提出了對人力資源的關注,認為其必須符合政府對未來發展項目的規劃。政府應提供計劃和基建項目的整體藍圖,讓業界人士有時間規劃和安排勞工及資源,從而無縫配合項目需要。

是次晚宴碩果豐盛,我非常高興看到學會間的 合作如此順利,尤其是為政府提供意見方面。 下一次晚宴定於四月舉行,由香港建築師學會 負責安排。

### 與中聯辦密切溝通

1月13日,學會與中聯辦舉行了一場非正式會談。中聯辦官員表達了對香港測量師學會的關顧,並詢問學會會員在內地開展業務,尤其是大灣區,需要甚麼類型的協助。這場長達一小時的面對面會議來得非常及時,恰逢中國內地放寬疫情限制措施後重新通關,香港市民得以一如既往地走訪內地。

因此,學會希望今年能到訪內地不同單位和機關,深入了解過去數年的變化與發展。另外, 中聯辦協助舉辦的國情研修班和青年組遊學活動亦即將復辦。

### 會長的話

### 以測量行業為先

1月17日,我出席了為建築及工程界而設的2023至2024年度財政預算案諮詢會,並對政府增加土地供應的果斷態度表示歡迎。鑑於香港每年整體建築量預計將達3,000億元,政府必須透過政策措施支持建築界,並確保有足夠的專業人員來推動目前和未來的項目——包括測量師、建築師和工程師,例如可以推出政策增加建築學、測量學和工程學(這些學科較少以研究為本)的大學招生人數,或者可以分配資源或補貼予香港高等教育科技學院(THEi)等機構組織舉辦非大學教育資助委員會資助的測量課程。

在諮詢過程中,我亦提出了防止人才流失的重要性。確保留住人才的關鍵之一,正是保持工程項目數量穩定一致,不會出現極端波動,導致專業人士在沒有工作時萌生去意。政府應要將香港打造成為一個宜居城市,可以令青年人安心留在香港發展。

此外,我於一月初向兩家本地報社投稿,撰文闡述我對促進測量行業發展的看法和擔憂(可掃描下方的二維碼,以下載專欄文章)。在《香港經濟日報》的文章中,我集中探討為測量行業提升專業形象的需要,並勉勵業界人士透過提出建議和意見回饋社會。在《星島日報》的文章中,我則提到測量專業人才短缺問題持續,尤其是大型基建項目如北部都會區發展策略,將刺激對測量師的需求。

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# How far are we from paperless property transactions?

While technological capabilities that support asset transactions already exist, paperless property transactions are yet to become a reality due to long-standing legal obstacles. The three surveyors interviewed for this cover story hope that at least, some parts of the transaction process can be digitised to streamline deal closings while ensuring all parties involved remain secure in their interests.

Selling a property usually starts with marketing it – either by creating sales brochures and obtaining pre-sale consent for developers selling off-plan property or advertising listings online through estate agents for individual sellers.

After viewing, negotiations and agreeing on prices and terms, the next step entails signing provisional and formal sale and purchase agreements. Prior to signing the formal agreement, the solicitor representing the purchaser carries out title investigations and searches; and for commercial real estate or development sites, land and building surveyors, among other professionals, are very often appointed to conduct site inspections and building surveys as part of the due diligence work.

To protect buyers' interests and ensure transparency, developers are required to upload price lists, property information, sales arrangements, and sales records to the Sales of First-hand Residential Properties Electronic Platform. Estate agents are legally obligated to do their best to ensure that the information about listings marketed through them is accurate.

As can be seen, most of the processes concerning property sales and transactions are still limited to information disclosure. Most of the processes, especially the conveyancing procedures, still require manual paperwork.

### Deed registration is a thing of the past

One major obstacle to paperless property transactions is the land title registration system, which has been operating as a deeds registrations system since 1844 in Hong Kong. The deed registration system is governed by the Land Registration Ordinance (Cap. 128). The downside of it is that it does not provide a guarantee of title to the property.

Under this regime, a purchaser's solicitor has to review historical title documents to establish good title to land. This process is complex and costly. Once registered, the transfer of title is recorded with details of ownership of the land and certain title documents which are made available to the public.

To enhance title certainty and simplify conveyancing procedures, the Land Titles Ordinance (Cap. 585) was enacted in 2004, according to LegCo's records.

The LTO aims to establish a new system in which the Title Register will provide conclusive evidence of title to and of interests in the registered land, in place of the present deeds registration system that gives no guarantee to title with a view to providing greater certainty to property titles and to simplify the procedures of checking title documents in conveyancing.

After nearly two decades, the Government has yet to finalise the Land Titles Ordinance (Cap. 585). In response to this, the HKIS has urged them multiple times over the years to look into the issue and find steps towards implementation, says **Sr Dr Conrad Tang**, Past Chairman of the Land Surveying Division of the HKIS.

The Government has stated in the past that

a comprehensive review must be completed before a title registration system can come into effect. Last year, the Land Registry confirmed that it would proceed with the preparation of the LTO by implementing it on newly granted land (i.e., land granted by the Government after the commencement of the LTO).

A 'daylight conversion mechanism' was once proposed. That means that after a 12-year period of the commencement of Cap. 585, the land will automatically undergo the last stage full conversion and be fully converted to registered land under the LTO.

During the primary conversion period, the Government will conduct basic screening on the title chain for existing land registers. The affected land or property will remain in the primary conversion stage, which Sr Tang suggests being remarked as 'provisional' until the relevant title issue is resolved, whereupon it can undergo full conversion.

According to Sr Tang, the biggest risk with this mechanism is that a one-off conversion could lead to titles being registered without clear ownership. This could end up making the Land Registry legally liable for potential compensation claims.

Apart from the complexities of conducting basic screenings of the title chain for existing land registers, how to address and mitigate the risks of claims from human errors during the conversion process that result in the loss of ownership is a substantial consideration, he says.

"Title insurance was thought to be a solution to such claims for compensation, and more recently the Government has suggested the establishment of 'Land Titles Indemnity Fund'. However, with the large amount of money that can be involved in property transactions, the scope of risk is huge and it's possible that criminals could take

advantage of potential loopholes to defraud the compensation system."

### Lessons to learn from other jurisdictions

Despite the complexities and risks, many other jurisdictions that had inherited the English common law system have undergone similar conversion processes.

The present Land Title Registration of England and Wales was brought into force by the Land Registration Act 1925, In 2002, it was updated to create a legislative framework for the introduction of electronic conveyancing.

In New South Wales, Australia, the old land title registration system has been phased out and replaced by the 'Torrens Title' system. This is where a record of each purchase is recorded at Land Registry Services and a Certificate of Title is issued in the new owner's name.

Singapore and Malaysia began their conversion processes in the 1960s. Further afield, many governments across Sub-Saharan Africa are also in the process of introducing or improving land registration and formal title registration systems. Hong Kong is lagging far behind other common law jurisdictions.

In EU countries that do not follow a title system such as the Netherlands, Kadaster, the Dutch cadastre, land registry and mapping agency, is responsible for the nation's registration of parcel boundaries (cadastral map) and the legal status of parcels (land registry), including information such as the address of the property, the date of the transaction, the purchase price, the size of the plot, information on the use of the land, information about the rights associated with the

land, information about possible obstacles.

Sr Tang believes that Hong Kong can learn valuable lessons from them in order to move ahead with electronic conveyancing. He suggests that, at the very least, new land granted by the Government should be brought directly onto the title registration system from now on.

### Central property transaction platform

To truly digitalise property transactions and enhance transparency, in addition to the migration of deed records to title registrations, it is also worth exploring the possibility of creating a centralised transaction platform like how securities are traded on the stock exchange, says **Sr Gilbert Chan**, Senior Director at property consultants Jones Lang LaSalle.

"Now that company shares and other securities are traded frequently online, while insurance and wealth management products can also be purchased online, that clearly means that the infrastructure is there and has been running smoothly," he says.

"Establishing a reliable and secure platform for real estate transactions can be done through either a regulatory body or an authorised organisation. Such a platform must have features such as fairness, transparency and legal safeguards that will give market participants peace of mind."

Regulators are very wary of money laundering and fraudulent activities related to property transactions due to their high monetary value and title clearance needs. However, he believes future fintech advancements can help tackle these issues.

Like mainland China, Hong Kong is taking steps

to make digital payments safer. The Government is planning on introducing a digital currency that can be used to trace the origin of funds and track money laundering activities. Blockchain technology might be used in the future for registering property titles when electronic conveyancing becomes available.

The Government has also developed 'iAM Smart' as a digital signature system that it has been promoting to financial institutions. The use of e-signatures is regulated by the Electronic Transactions Ordinance (Chapter 553).

"While the ETO states that documents concerning land and property transactions are not suitable for electronic signing, I believe that some paperwork handled by estate agents, lawyers and surveyors that requires handwritten signatures can be replaced with e-signatures."

Property transactions still involve a significant amount of paperwork; however, developers, estate agents, mortgage brokers and banks have leveraged digital tools to make property purchases easier and more efficient, he adds, citing examples such as virtual home tours, instant mortgage quotes and pre-approvals, among other emerging proptech solutions.

### See to believe

Sr Chan highlights that despite the growing use of digital channels in engaging with potential homebuyers, it is important for them to visit the show house or the property personally in order to make the final and most informed decision.

"Homebuyers often make a purchase decision based on their sentiment and feeling towards the property on the spot, as long as they have researched the property thoroughly online and through other marketing channels," he says. According to **Sr Matthew Chow**, Executive Director of Hanison Group, having buyers visit and view luxury properties in person is very important in closing a sale. His firm currently has four such high-end projects in the development pipeline.

"Seeing a space in person is essential when understanding the architecture of a building, such as the use of material, natural lighting and ventilation. Visualisation technology can't quite compare to experiencing these elements firsthand," he says.

As a General Practice surveyor who has led various redevelopment projects before, Sr Chow supports the orderly conversion of deeds to title registrations, which may also facilitate property acquisitions for redevelopment purposes.

Under the proposed title registration system, he believes that older properties with doubtful titles will become more marketable, thus enabling faster acquisition and maximising redevelopment potential in older areas.

## 無紙化房地產交易,還有多遠?

儘管支援資產交易的技術已經成熟,但礙於根深 蒂固的法律框架,要在香港實現無紙化房地產交 易還有很遠的路要走。儘管如此,今期封面故事 訪問的三位測量師都認為,即使物業交易只有部 份程序能夠電子化,也能簡化交易,更有效確保 交易雙方利益。

在一手物業銷售方面,發展商要出售在建的發展 項目,須取得預售樓花同意書和上載樓書,才能 展開銷售活動。而放盤的二手業主,通常會委託 地產代理並於網上刊登樓盤廣告。

在「睇樓」後並就樓價和條款達成協議後,下一 步就是買賣雙方簽署臨時和正式買賣協議。在簽 署正式買賣合約前,代表買方的律師會進行土地 查冊,以檢查業權是否存在負擔或俗稱的「瑕 疵」。對於貴重商業物業或發展用地,買方還會 委派土地和建築測量師以及其他專業人士,進行 實地考察和測量工作。

為保障買家利益及確保透明度,發展商須將詳細 的價單、樓盤資料、銷售安排及銷售紀錄等資料 上載至一手住宅物業銷售資訊網。地產代理也有 法律義務盡最大努力確保其代理的樓盤資訊準確 無誤。

由此可見,香港大部份涉及物業銷售及交易的程 序仍局限於信息披露,尤其是業權追踪和轉讓等 程序,仍然需要依賴相當的人力和文書工作。

### 契約註冊制度已不合時宜

究其原因,無紙化物業交易的主要障礙是香港的 土地業權註冊制度落後。香港現行的土地註冊制 度是契約註冊制度,自 1844 年開始根據《土地 註冊條例》(《土註條例》)(第128章)運作, 只規管在土地登記冊內已註冊文書的優先次序, 但不提供物業業權的保證。

在此制度下,買方律師必須審查歷史業權文件以確定土地的良好業權,過程複雜費時。一經註冊, 業權轉讓將被記錄在案,包括土地所有權的詳細 資訊,而公眾可查閱部份資料。

根據立法會紀錄,《土地業權條例》(第585章) (《業權條例》)於2004年7月通過,以加強 業權的確定性和簡化財產轉讓的程序。

在業權註冊制度下,土地業權是透過註冊而獲得, 為物業業權提供更大保證和明確性,並簡化物業 轉易程序,以取代目前無法確保業權的契約登記 制度。這將增加業權的安全性,並簡化在業權轉 讓過程中的查冊過程。

可是,近二十年以來,政府仍未最終確定《業權條例》。學會土地測量組前主席鄧康偉博士測量師指出,學會多年來亦多次促請政府繼續研究《業權條例》的具體時間表。

過去,政府曾表示業權註冊制度必須完成全面檢討,方可實施。去年,土地註冊處亦重申將着手 擬備《業權條例》的修訂,以落實「新土地先行」 方案。

多年前,政府曾經提出「白晝轉換機制」,即在《業權條例》生效後十二年,土地將自動進入完全轉換的最後階段,並按照《業權條例》 全面計冊。

在轉換首階段,政府將對現有土 地登記冊進行業權鏈的基本篩選。 鄧康偉測量師建議,在相關產權 問題解決之前,可考慮將受影響 土地或物業標記為「臨時」,直 到相關業權問題得到釐清後才進 行全面轉換。 他解釋,轉換機制最大風險在於有可能影響業權 註冊紀錄的準確性,土地註冊處有可能因而承擔 法律賠償責任。此外,如何解決和緩解在轉換過 程中因人為錯誤而導致業權喪失的索賠風險,亦 是一個重要的考量。

「針對索賠風險,過去有建議設立業權保險,政府最近則建議設立土地業權彌償基金。然而,由於房地產交易可能涉及巨大金額,不法之徒有可能會利用賠償制度的潛在漏洞而作出詐騙行為, 風險範圍頗大。|

### 從其他司法管轄區的轉換經驗取經

儘管轉換過程存在相當的複雜性和風險,但若干其他繼承英國普通法的司法管轄區,也經歷了類似的轉換過程。英格蘭和威爾斯目前的土地業權註冊制度乃根據《1925 年土地註冊法令》實施,該法令於 2002 年更新,引入電子業權轉讓的法律框架。

在澳洲新南威爾斯州,舊的土地業權註冊系統已 被《托倫斯所有權系統》逐步淘汰並取而代之。 該地區土地註冊服務處負責記錄每次買賣,並以



新業主名義簽發業權證書。至於新加坡和馬來西亞則於 1960 年代啟動轉換。遠在非洲,許多撒哈拉以南地區的政府也正引入或改進土地註冊和正式的業權註冊制度。相比之下,香港遠落後於其他普通法司法管轄區。

一些歐盟國家並不遵循業權註冊制度,以荷蘭為例,Kadaster是該國的地籍、土地登記和測繪機構,負責宗地邊界登記(地籍地圖)及其法律地位(土地註冊)。Kadaster詳細記錄了物業地址、交易日期、成交價、地塊大小、土地利用資訊、土地相關使用權利和可能的障礙等資料。

鄧康偉測量師認為,香港可以借鑑其他國家和地區的寶貴經驗和教訓,推動電子業權轉讓制度。他建議,現階段最起碼要落實政府提倡的「新土地先行」方案,先將所有新批出的土地直接納入業權計冊制度。

### 中央物業交易平台

為實現房地產交易數碼化轉型,仲量聯行資深董事陳志康測量師建議,除了將現有土地轉換至業權註冊制度之外,還可以創建一個房地產的中央交易平台,就如現時的股票及證券交易平台。

「現在,公司股票和其他證券都可以網上交易, 保險和理財產品也可以上網購買。顯然,支援資 產網上交易的軟硬件都已相當成熟。」他建議, 監管機構或政府認證機構可創建公平、明確且受 法律支持的交易平台,為物業交易各方提供最大 程度的保證。

無可厚非,監管機構非常警惕與資產交易相關的 洗錢和欺詐活動,特別是涉及巨額的房地產交易。 不過,他相信未來金融科技的進步可以幫助解決 這些問題。與內地一樣,香港正計劃推行數碼港 元,包括其法律地位、私隱及數據保障,可幫助 追尋不法資金和打擊洗錢活動。假以時日,當《業 權條例》運行成熟時,亦可考慮將區塊鏈技術應用於業權計冊。

另外,政府還開發了「iAM Smart」數碼簽名系統,受《電子交易條例》(第 553 章)規管,政府亦一直有向金融機構推廣「iAM Smart」。雖然現時《電子交易規例》規定與土地和物業交易有關的文件不適合電子簽名,但陳志康測量師認為,一些由地產代理、律師和測量師處理的文件可考慮以電子簽名代替。

總括而言,雖然香港的物業交易仍然涉及大量文書工作,但他指出發展商、代理、按揭轉介公司和銀行已經通過不同的房地產科技平台,例如虛擬「睇樓」、即時按揭報價和預批等服務,務求簡化物業買賣。

### 遇見「心頭好」的即場決定

陳志康測量師強調,儘管房地產科技平台大行其 道,但準買家仍需親臨展銷廳或放盤單位,才能 作出最終決定。他表示,只要準買家提前做足功 課,往往在感受到現場氣氛和示範單位間隔裝修 及配套設施後,就能更果斷作出決定。

### 释放城市潜能 共享智慧生活—— 2022 年各地稳步推进新城建工作综述

2022 年,各地有序推进新型城市基础设施建设 (以下简称"新城建"),一些可观有效的项目 落地,多项技术实现迭代升级,人民生活更加美 好。丰厚的建设成果也将为今年的新城建工作的 探索和深入提供经验,形成新的推动力。

#### • 多批试点有效落地

#### 智能建造加速推进 数字家庭服务民生

基于信息化、数字化、智能化的新城建,以新发展理念为引领,以技术创新为驱动,以信息网络为基础,为城市高质量发展提供数字转型、智能升级、融合创新等服务。各地开展新城建试点,既为今后的工作推动"投石问路",也将为其他城市提供更为切实有效的工作经验。

为全面推进建筑业向新型工业化、数字化、绿色化转型,2022年11月,住房和城乡建设部印发通知,选取北京、天津等24个城市开展智能建造试点,积极探索建筑业转型发展的新路径。

智能建造试点工作的预期目标包括:加快推进科技创新,提升建筑业发展质量和效益。围绕数字设计、智能生产、智能施工、建筑产业互联网、建筑机器人、智慧监管六大方面,挖掘一批典型应用场景,形成高效益、高质量、低消耗、低排放的新型建造方式。培育骨干建筑业企业,增强建筑业企业国际竞争力,形成可感知、可量化、可评价的成效。

试点工作也覆盖了保障民生、提升数字化服务这一层面。近年来,智能家居、智慧家庭等多样化的概念被不断提出,如今可以融入到"数字家庭"这一范畴。

2021年4月,住房和城乡建设部等16个部门联合发布《关于加快发展数字家庭提高居住品质的指导意见》,正式吹响了家庭数字化发展的号角。

2022 年 8 月,住房和城乡建设部、工业和信息化部联合发布《关于开展数字家庭建设试点工作的通知》,确定北京市昌平区等 19 个试点。试点城区的公布拉开了数字家庭正式落地实施建设的序幕。

试点明确以居住社区为单元,加大住宅和社区信息基础设施建设力度,部署感知终端,做好智能家居产品数据汇聚,推动智能家居产品、用户、数据跨企业互联互通;建设开放的数字家庭系统基础平台,加强与智慧物业管理、智慧社区信息系统等的对接,满足居民线上获取政务、社会和智能化服务的需求。以试点为契机,将探索形成的经验和模式推广至全国,加速数字家庭在全国的普及。

陕西省在数字家庭建设中稳步探索。去年6月,陕西省住房和城乡建设厅等18个部门联合印发《关于加快发展数字家庭提高居住品质的实施意见》,提出打造数字家庭体系、强化数字安全保障等工作任务。以城市或市辖区为单元,西安安区的等城市率先开展数字家庭建设试点。力争到2025年年底,在新建全装修住宅和基础条件好的新建住宅小区配套中拥有一定的智能产品服务、公营监管于一体的数字家庭产业生态。

### • 多项技术迭代更新

#### 智慧设施实现突破 城市建设迎来机遇

2022年,在新城建推进过程中,多项技术实现迭代创新,"东数西算"工程为智慧城市建设提供技术和数据支撑,自动驾驶实现新突破,智慧灯杆让市民生活更便捷。

2022 年 2 月,国家发改委等部门联合印发文件,同意在京津冀、长三角、粤港澳大湾区、成渝、内蒙古、贵州等地启动建设国家算力枢纽节点并规划 10 个国家数据中心集群,"东数西算"工程启动。

"东数西算"工程作为智慧城市建设发展的重要驱动力,为数字经济提供强而有力的技术支持。智慧城市的建设需要大量的数据进行交叉分析,

"东数西算"工程为各地的智慧城市建设提供了数据中心,将成为智慧城市最终落地发展的关键。

### 北京办事处简讯

2022年,我国在自动驾驶方面也实现了多个新突破。 2022年8月,《自动驾驶汽车运输安全服务指南(试行)》等文件印发,加速自动驾驶商业化进程。广东、上海、江苏、湖南、重庆都管理等问题。其中,同年8月实施的《深圳经济哲区智能网联汽车管理条例》是国内首部关于智能网联汽车管理的法规,对市场准入规则等方面进行详细规定。随著政策的逐渐明朗,自动驾驶行业将迈入"真枪实干"阶段,迎来技术快速演进、产业加速布局的关键时期。

智慧设施更新也在贴近人民生活中实现突破。

智慧灯杆是智慧城市的组成部分,也是物联网重要的信息采集来源。在"新基建"浪潮下,智慧灯杆成为近年来各地重点支持的方向之一。

2022年3月,智慧灯杆领域首个国家级标准《智慧城市智慧多功能杆服务功能与运行管理规范》实施,对杆体分类、设计、布局和功能等方面作出要求。行业标准的制定与实施为智慧灯杆行业的各个领域发展提供了标准依据,行业将朝著规范化方向发展,在加快推进智慧城市建设进程中,迎来了发展新机遇。

### • 多个热点引发关注

#### 多元探索推动增长 数字经济优化升级

2022 年以来,各地稳步推进新城建项目落地开工,探索可持续发展模式,促进经济平稳增长, 多个热点引发社会各界关注。

2022年,《"十四五"数字经济发展规划》印发,明确推动数字经济健康发展的指导思想、重点任务和保障措施,部署优化升级数字基础设施、持续提升公共服务数字化水平等任务。

各地加快部署新城建工作,夯实数字经济发展基础,聚焦大数据、人工智能等领域,培育数字产业集群,打造数字经济发展高地。北京深入落实数字经济标杆城市建设实施方案,四川高质量完成国家数字经济创新发展试验区建设任务,江苏把做强做优数字经济作为转型发展的关键增量,统筹数字经济、数字政府、数字社会生态体系建设。

社区是党和政府联系、服务居民群众的"最后一公里"。新城建工作将工作目标对准完整社区建设,通过补短板、强弱项,提升人民群众的生活水平。

2022年,《住房和城乡建设部办公厅民政部办公厅关于开展完整社区建设试点工作的通知》发布,聚焦群众关切的"一老一幼"设施建设,聚焦为民、便民、安民服务,打造一批安全健康、设施完善、管理有序的完整社区样板,全力改善人居环境。引入物联网、云计算、大数据、区块炼和人工智能等技术推进智能化服务,建设智慧物业管理服务平台,促进线上线下服务融合发展,并与城市运行管理服务平台、智能家庭终端互联知通,提供一体化管理和服务。推进社区智能感知设施建设,提高社区治理智能化水平。

2022年,元宇宙热度不减,多地政府释放超前布局元宇宙的信号,将元宇宙纳入未来产业发展体系,纷纷涌入元宇宙赛道。

随著 5G(第五代移动通信技术)、数字孪生等技术的不断推进,众多元宇宙产品在智慧城市多个领域的应用场景加速落地,实现产业的升级转型。2022 年 9 月,河南省发布《河南省元宇宙产业发展行动计划(2022~2025 年)》,发展智慧城市元宇宙,聚焦城市地下空间管理、城市规划全生命周期管理等问题,依托空间分析计算、动态模拟仿真推演等优势,优化城市治理方案。积极探索数字孪生城市,进一步完善城市信息模型,提升城市治理效能。

### • 多类平台实现协同

### 智慧平台解决难题 治理效能持续提升

2022 年 3 月,住房和城乡建设部印发通知,部署各地在开展城市综合管理服务平台建设和联网工作的基础上,全面加快建设城市运行管理服务平台,推动城市运行管理"一网统管"。

城市运行管理服务平台体系包括国家平台、省级平台和市级平台,三级平台互联互通、数据同步、业务协同。为稳妥有序推进建设,住房和城乡建设部同步发布《城市运行管理服务平台建设指南》《城市运行管理服务平台数据标准》,作为现阶段指导城市运行管理服务平台建设和运行的基本依据。

## BEIJING OFFICE NEWS 北京办事处简讯

各地纷纷落实要求,启动建设城市运行管理服务 平台,力争使城市运行管理服务平台成为提升城 市科学化、精细化、智能化治理水平的重要抓手, 解决好民生堵点、痛点、难点问题,成为政府高 效履职、管理好城市、服务好市民的重要帮手。

青岛市城市运行管理服务平台与国家平台、省级 平台实现联通,围绕城市运行管理各类事项,推 动跨部门、跨层级、跨区域数据资源汇聚融合、 开放共享和深度利用,已建成包含 1400 馀项数据 目录、44个专题库的城市运行管理服务数据库。 宁波市以"一网统管"为主导,实现"152" 体化智能化公共数据平台 +5 个综合应用 + 数字 化改革的理论体系和制度规范体系)与"141" (一中心四平台一网格)体系贯通,加速推进城 市运行管理服务平台迭代升级。

2023年,新城建将继续助力城市治理水平提升, 释放城市发展潜能,让市政设施更安全、出行更 便捷、生活更美好。


"LiDAR: Doom or a Boon?"





### BEAM Plus Portfolio Assessment for Sustainability and Decarbonisation **Transformation**

#### Reported by Sr Jonathan Lee, PFMD Vice Chairman

Climate change and extreme weather are issues that greatly concern the world. They cause not only hotter-than-normal weather, but also life and property damage, which seriously affect everyone living in this global village. Reducing greenhouse gas emissions from building operations is an effective measure, as buildings consume over 90% of Hong Kong's electricity generation. A webinar, "Experience-Sharing on Applying BEAM Plus Portfolio Assessment in Existing Building to Accelerate Sustainability and Decarbonisation Transformation," occurred on 26 August for participants to share the latest developments in green building standards and help their fellow PFM professionals figure out how to improve buildings' environmental

performance. The speaker, Mr Tim Lo is BEAM Society Limited's Head of System Development. His company spearheaded the BEAM Plus Portfolio Assessment and iBEAM Assessment Automation System and aims to help owners and managers of existing buildings subscribe to sustainable and decarbonisation practices.

Tim began by introducing the BEAM Plus Portfolio Assessment and elaborating on how this assessment tool could help property managers and building owners understand the sustainability management practices and energy use of existing buildings. He also explained the green finance opportunities and digitalisation provisions to support practitioners who use BEAM Plus assessment tools. During the Q&A session, I moderated a discussion on the practical difficulties of implementing green measures and assessments on existing buildings, as well as best management practices for green buildings. Tim's presentation concluded with plenty of positive comments from and appreciation by participants.

# CPD: Launch of the BIM Measurement Information Requirements, 13 January 2023

The QSD's Digitalisation Sub-committee recently drafted a new document, "BIM Measurement Information Requirements" (MIR), which launched on 6 December for a month's industry consultation.

During the CPD, QSD Chairman Sr Sunny Choi outlined the background of the preparations for the MIR and introduced its key features. He mentioned that most, if not all, of the information required for quantity takeoff (QTO) is basic information in BIM models, and they are required for construction or fabrication. The MIR serves two main purposes: (1) as an effective communication tool with designers and modellers and (2) as a guide for QSs who work on BIM QTO. Sunny stressed that the perception that QSs are always asking for specific QS models for QTO is obsolete. In fact, QSs seek opportunities to work with other disciplines to provide maximum value to the clients who adopt BIM in their projects.

Sunny said that the launch of the MIR is not the end, but the start of the journey of enhanced digitalisation of quantity surveying works. Individual clients, QS consultants, and contractors have worked out some practices or tools to digitise the QTO and/or the tendering processes. Further research is required to explore the standardisation of data structures or setting up a coding system to facilitate the exchange of cost-related information across disciplines, throughout the project life cycle of built assets.

Digitalisation Sub-committee members Sr Dr Paul Ho, Sr Rachel Yu, Sr Katherine Shum, Mr Kelvin Kuo, Mr Put Hui, Sr Ellie Yeung, Sr Sundy Or, and Sr Rex Ying attended the event. During its Q&A session, Sunny, Paul, Katherine, Kelvin, and Put answered the audience's questions and shared their own experiences and views on the promotion and development of BIM applications for quantity

# HKIS Feature Article Case Study – Soliciting Advantages for Others

Some members of the Hong Kong Institute of Surveyors (HKIS) are working in government bureaux/departments. In addition to their official position, some may volunteer themselves to be office bearers of various professional institutions, sports associations or charity organisations, etc. Since government officers are subject to stringent integrity requirements under the law, they should be mindful of the legal compliance when representing their affiliated organisations to solicit and accept advantages from others, in particular those with official dealings with the Government. The Corruption Prevention Department of the ICAC sets out the following case study which highlights the key legal provisions of the anti-corruption law in Hong Kong as well as the associated integrity risk for reference by HKIS's members.

#### **Case in Perspective**

Tom was a professional surveyor working in a government department and he was responsible, inter alia, for monitoring the work of a contractor, ABC Company, in a works project. Tom was also a committee member of a professional institution which was organising an event to celebrate its 30th anniversary. Tom solicited and accepted a sponsorship of \$10,000 from a director of ABC Company to fund the event without seeking permission from his department.

#### Legal Requirements

In accordance with the Prevention of Bribery Ordinance (POBO, Cap 201), it is an offence if:

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- Section 3 of POBO: a prescribed officer (e.g. a government officer), without the general or special permission of the Chief Executive, solicits or accepts any advantage.
- Section 8 of POBO: any person, without lawful authority or reasonable excuse, having any business dealings of any kind with a government department/office or a public body, offer any advantage to any government officer employed in that department/office or public servant employed by that public body.

The maximum penalty is a \$100,000 fine and one year's imprisonment for the offence in Section 3 of POBO and \$500,000 fine and seven years' imprisonment for the offence in Section 8 of POBO.

The Government has given the general permission to government officers to solicit and/ or accept advantages other than the four types of "restricted advantages", namely gifts (whether of money or otherwise), discounts, loans of money and passages. For the "restricted advantages", government officers are required to seek special permission from the designated authorities for their solicitation/acceptance.

#### **Corruption Risk Analysis**

Under POBO, a government officer is regarded as soliciting/accepting an advantage, if he, or any other person acting on his behalf, directly or indirectly demands or asks for / receives or agrees to receive, an advantage, whether for himself or **for another person**. In the above case, Tom could commit an offence under Section 3 of POBO as he, being a government officer and while having official dealings with ABC Company, solicited and accepted \$10,000 (i.e. an restricted advantage) from the director of ABC Company even though the sponsorship/advantage was solicited and accepted for the

professional institution. Besides, the director of ABC Company could also commit an offence under Section 8 of POBO for offering the advantage to Tom while having business dealing with the government department Tom was working.

#### **Preventive Measure**

Surveyors working in the Government soliciting or accepting advantages on behalf of others, including organisations such as professional institutions, charity organisations and sports associations, in the capacity as members or office bearers of the organisations should -

observe the rules and regulations of the Government on solicitation and acceptance of advantages when doing so (please refer to the Acceptance of Advantages (Chief Executive's Permission) Notice for details (https:// www.csb.gov.hk/english/rcim/central/ files/aan e.pdf));

- seek special permission from the designated authorities in their departments if they want/need to solicit/ accept any "restricted advantages";
- ensure that the solicitation or acceptance of such advantages will not give rise to conflict of interest with their official duties or bring the Government into disrepute;
- alternatively, the government officer (office bearer) could refer the sponsorship solicitation to be directly dealt with by the institution secretariat.

It should connect or have implications for fellow members, be they serious thoughts on the constitution or future of the profession or simply as a gadget or trick that can benefit the day-to-day practices of surveyors. Articles should not be political or directly related to one's personal benefit for fear of litigation from individuals or organisations. The sensitivity and security of information presented also need to be borne in mind.

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
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
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
