y tenure as President of the Institute has been a challenging but fulfilling experience. But I'm proud to be leading our mission to promote excellence and development among surveyors. This month, in particular, has been filled with initiatives to support young surveyors, promote awareness of construction site safety, while providing advice for our policymakers to ensure a steady talent pipeline.

Empowering young surveyors

As stated in my first President's Message, actively engaging with young members and making them feel a sense of belonging is important as we build the future of the Institute. I'm especially proud of the way the Young Surveyors Group (YSG) engages with young members, motivating them to excel in their professional goals. I'm delighted to see how these relationships strengthen over time with the help of team building and mentorship activities.

This month, the YSG organised two meaningful events, the first being a dragon boat race on 2 April, of which I had the honour of being invited by YSG Chairman Sr Wilson Ko as guest. It was truly an exciting day as our HKIS Dragon Boat team '港測龍' won the third place of the Silver Trophy of the Buildings Department's 30th Anniversary Cup at the 4th Kwun Tong Waterfront Sunshine Dragon Boat Race. Our team showcased their tandem paddling techniques, not slowing down until the last moments. It was great to see the joy and happiness on everyone's faces as they worked together against other rival teams. This brought an unbreakable bond to the team and made them realise how important teamwork is through camaraderie, encouragement and competition.

I was also delighted to be the guest speaker at the 'Empowering our Next Generation of Leaders' event, also hosted by the YSG. The Under Secretary of the Housing Bureau, Victor Tai, was the Guest of Honour to kick start the event and deliver the opening remark. I shared my own experiences and motivated attendees to consider advancing their professional aspirations.

During their sharing, three young surveyors shared their success stories and experiences about their respective career paths and how they have achieved great heights in the private sector. This sharing was the 1st Dialogue Event of our Young Leader Series.

Promoting site safety

Hong Kong has recorded numerous major industrial accidents since last year, with at least 13 construction worker deaths at construction sites. As surveyors, we play a critical role in ensuring the safety of our colleagues, clients and their workers.

To raise awareness about this issue, we gave our support to the Construction Industry Council (CIC) CEO Safety Forum 2023 held on 27 March. The forum is meant to gain insight from industry experts and leaders on correcting and improving construction safety culture. Moreover, this forum is also intended to review the outcomes of the 'Construction Safety Summit 2022' and provide valuable suggestions and

advice on how to share experience for further improving safety standards.

Apart from supporting the CIC forum, we have recently hosted a site safety CPD event at the Surveyors Learning Centre with Tony Lam, CIC's Head of Construction Safety (Industry Development) as the guest speaker. During the presentation, he gave valuable insights on how construction stakeholders can integrate safety into the design process. Moreover, he provided an update on CIC's work related to design for safety and shared his understanding of promoting safety and sustainability culture.

Security of Payment (SOP) legislation

The government's intended SOP legislation is recognised as an effective way of ensuring that main contractors, subcontractors, consultants and other vendors are paid fairly and can maintain healthy cash flow. The Hong Kong construction industry has been considering implementing SOP legislation for over ten years. The Hong Kong Government's release of Technical Circular (Works) No.6/2021 has the effect of introducing mandatory SOP provisions into Public Works Contracts.

Based on a recent discussion with the DevB on 18 April, it is expected that the SOP bill will be enacted after its passage through the Legislative Council in the coming year. The Institute will continue to work closely with government officials and, as appropriate, consult with our members in evaluating their views and providing input in a timely manner.

Bridging the talent gap

According to CIC forecasts, a 'considerable' talent shortage is expected in building professionals from 2024 to 2027. In other words, there will be approximately 16% to 25% gap

between the number of professionals that exist today and those needed in the next four years.

The concern of talent shortage echoes throughout the surveying profession and the broader building and construction industry. This month, I had the opportunity to converse with different professional organisations regarding this critical issue in the surveying profession.

At a dinner held between the Hong Kong Institute of Architects (HKIA), Hong Kong Institute of Landscape Architects (HKILA), Hong Kong Institute of Planners (HKIP) and Hong Kong Institution of Engineers (HKIE) on 12 April, one major issue discussed was that of talent shortage. Including our Institute, all five professional bodies are facing difficulty in sourcing skilled personnel and therefore request for support from the government in formulating suitable policies to bolster manpower supply.

During another meeting that took place on 17 April with our Quantity Surveying Division (QSD) and the Association of Consultant Quantity Surveyors (ACQS), the representatives discussed about whether surveying staff, including QS, could be imported from the mainland through the existing 'Facilitation Measures under the General Employment Policy and the Admission Scheme for mainland Talents and Professionals', but that would need the support of the Development Bureau (DevB).

Additionally, the meeting covered accreditation of overseas courses and degrees to make sure that the surveying staff members from the mainland and abroad possess qualifications that comply with the requirements of HKQF Level 5. It was also proposed that local universities should provide increased access to QS courses or degree programmes and review, assess and update the syllabus of existing surveying degree programmes in local universities in line

with latest trends and promote surveying as a lifelong career.

Trusted think-tank for policymakers

In fact, our policymakers are becoming increasingly aware of the fact that there isn't enough available talent to meet all the Greater Bay Area's development needs. As a result, the Institute has taken a proactive stance in offering advice and input when it comes to workforce and professional shortage.

The Liaison Office of the Central Government in Hong Kong held a discussion with representatives from various professional bodies, including myself, on 21 April. The aim was to exchange ideas on Hong Kong's development trends, how to cope with challenges and seize opportunities, enhance quality and productivity, and ways to address talent shortages.

The DevB has sought out my opinion twice on including surveyors in their 'Talent List Hong Kong'. The Institute welcomes qualified surveyors from mainland China and overseas to work in Hong Kong. A detailed discussion is now being scheduled to clarify the qualifications for surveyors to be included in the Talent List.

Overall, the Institute supports the government's efforts to address the manpower needs of Hong Kong's building and construction sector and is open-minded about imports of talent from the mainland and abroad. The Institute also emphasises the importance of local talent development. Therefore, we still have to discuss this matter further with different divisions and more members.

擔任學會會長以來,會務工作充滿挑戰, 盡心履行學會推廣測量專業和培育後進的使命,促進行業卓越和發展,也因而感到自豪。尤其是本月,學會組織及參與了一系列活動,支持年輕會員,推廣建築工地安全意識,並為決策部門就建造業人手短缺的問題提供具體建議。

賦能年輕測量師

正如我在第一則會長的話中所述,積極與年輕會員互動,提升他們對學會的歸屬感,對培育未來 接班人至關重要。我尤其為青年組與年輕會員的 互動感到自豪,透過不同的啟導交流和康樂活動, 能鼓勵他們在事業上更進一步,培養團隊精神。 我很高興在青年組的努力推廣下,新一代測量師 與學會的關係更加緊密。

以本月為例,青年組分別參與和舉辦了兩項十分 有意義的活動。學會龍舟代表隊「港測龍」獲屋 宇署邀請,參加了於4月2日假觀塘海濱舉行的 「屋宇署邁向三十週年盃 — 2023 觀塘海濱陽光 龍舟賽」。我有幸獲青年組主席高德仁測量師邀 請出席是次龍舟比賽,親身鼓勵參賽健兒。

「港測龍」健兒展現了他們齊整一致的划槳技巧, 隨著鼓聲節奏,一鼓作氣,奮力向前划過終點, 最終取得盃賽銀杯第3名。過程裡,他們表現出 無比毅力和團隊精神,比賽結束後,每位運動員 的臉上洋溢著喜悦和成功感。

其後,我於4月29日再獲青年組邀請,出席「賦 能新一代領袖」啟導活動,此乃「年輕領袖系列」 的第一場交流活動。房屋局副局長戴尚誠先生為 該交流活動的榮譽嘉賓,並發表了開幕詞。我也 分享了自己的經驗,鼓勵與會者挑戰自我。在分 享討論環節上,三位來自私人機構的年輕測量師, 跟與會者分享了他們各自的職業生涯道路和成功 秘訣。

推廣工地安全

自去年以來,香港已經發生了多宗重大工業事故, 至少有13名建築工人在地盤工作期間意外身故。

作為測量師,我們非常重視在工地上的同事、客 戶和他們所聘用工人的安全,持續努力提高安全 意識,實踐工地安全措施,以確保類似悲劇不再 發生。

為提高業界對建築工地安全問題的認識,我們支持了於3月27日由建造業議會舉辦的「CEO安 全論壇2023」。論壇雲集了業界領袖及專家,就 改善工地安全文化進行了深入交流,並檢視「建 造業安全峰會2022」的跟進工作,進一步提高安 全標準。

除了支持該論壇外,我們最近還在測量師研習中 心,舉辦了一場以工地安全為主題的持續專業發 展活動,邀得建造業議會工業發展建築安全主管 林穎東先生擔任嘉賓講者。在演講中,他分享了 有關如何將安全性融入設計的見解,介紹了建造 業議會有關為安全而設計的工作進展情況,以及 分享了他對推廣工地安全和可持續文化的理解。

《建造業付款保障條例》立法

《建造業付款保障條例》的目的,是確保總承建 商、分包商、顧問和供應商能夠及時公正地獲得 應得款項。過去十多年,香港建造業一直考慮實 施付款保障條款,直至近期,香港政府發布了技 術通函(工程)第6/2021號,將付款保障條款引 入公共工程合同,以作試行。

根據 4 月 18 日與發展局的一次討論,預計《建造 業付款保障條例》將於來年獲立法會通過後予以 實施,學會將繼續與政府官員密切溝通,並適時 徵詢並向有關部門反映會員意見。

彌補人才缺口

根據建造業議會預測,由 2024 年至 2027 年,建 造專業人員將出現「相當大」的人才短缺。換句 話說,今天存在的專業人員人數與未來四年所需 人數之間將存在約 16% 至 25% 的差距,引起了 測量業及建造行業的共同關注。因此,我們不時 與政府部門和其他專業團體交流,探討緩解人才 短缺的可行措施。 4月12日,學會與香港建築師學會、香港園境師 學會、香港規劃師學會和香港工程師學會等專業 學會舉行聯合晚宴,席間討論了人才短缺問題, 五個學會均予以認同,並希望政府提供適切支援, 加強人力供應。

另於4月17日,學會工料測量組和顧問工料測量 師協會代表舉行了例會,代表們討論了是否可以 通過現行的「一般就業政策和輸入內地人才計劃 的便利措施」,從內地引入測量師,包括工料測 量師,但這需要發展局的支持。

會議還討論了相關海外課程和學位的認證,以確 保來自內地和海外的測量師,擁有符合香港資歷 架構第5級要求的相等資格。另有與會者建議本 地大學增加工料測量課程或學位學額,並審視和 優化本地大學目前測量學位的課程大綱,以反映 行業最新趨勢,推廣測量作為終身職業。

值得信賴的智庫

事實上,政府部門和有關單位已越來越意識到, 建造業人才短缺有可能會拖慢大灣區發展步伐。 有見及此,學會積極為決策部門提供建議和意見。 中聯辦於4月21日與各專業團體代表召開會議, 我代表學會出席了會議,就香港的發展趨勢、如 何應對挑戰和抓住機遇、提升建造業質量和生產 力、以及就人才短缺問題,與中聯辦及其他專業 團體交換意見,探討解決方案。

此外,發展局亦曾兩次徵詢我將測量師納入「人 才清單」的意見。學會原則上歡迎海內外合資格 專業測量師為香港和大灣區發展作出貢獻,現正 安排一次詳細討論,以釐清納入「人才清單」的 測量師資格。

總體來說,學會支持政府為滿足香港建造業的人 力需求所作的努力,並對從內地和海外引進人才 抱持開放態度。與此同時,學會也強調本地人才 培訓的重要性,所以我們仍需與各組別更多會員 作進一步討論。

The supply of surveyors, pivotal to Hong Kong's land and housing development, is seeing a shortage in recent years. With Lantau Tomorrow, Northern Metropolis, major road and railway projects as well as other mega infrastructural projects in the pipeline, surveyors will continue to be in high demand. To prevent continual imbalance between the supply and demand of talents, the HKIS is taking actions to attract and retain surveyors in the industry, as well as resorting to technology to reduce manpower needed.

"The mismatch between supply and demand for professionals in construction, surveying and engineering services in relation to real estate and construction will rise from 4,000 in 2023 to 6,500 in 2027, according to the Construction Industry Council's (CIC) Construction Expenditure Forecast. Construction expenditure during the 10-year period from 2021/2022 to 2030/2031 is expected to be over HK\$300 billion per annum," said Sr Paul Wong Kwokleung, HKIS President.

"Surveying graduates have always enjoyed close to 100% employment upon graduation. With seasoned surveyors retiring and some surveyors emigrating, as well as mega projects being launched, the talent shortage will become more serious. If the shortage persists, Hong Kong's ability to solve housing and land issues will be affected," Sr Wong continued. Potential solutions are oriented towards two directions: attracting more talents to the surveying industry, and finding alternative ways to reduce the human resources needed.

Full employment even during economic downturn

The surveying industry is attractive in a number of ways. The starting salary for fresh graduates before qualification has been increasing, amounting to around \$18,000 to \$25,000. Annual pay raises of 10% or even 30% have been common, particularly this year. Quantity Surveyors, General Practice Surveyors and Land Surveyors who are members of the HKIS with minimum one-year post-qualification experience can have salaries from \$60,000 to \$110,000 or more, according to the government's salary scale.

Sr Wong stated, "With expertise in land, real estate development and building construction, surveyors contribute to housing, workplace, leisure, and basically every aspect of our daily lives. From mapping land boundaries, planning and development, project supervision, cost management, real estate investment to property management and building maintenance, surveyors play important roles in every process."

Sr Leonie Chan Yuet-man, Vice Chairman of the HKIS' Young Surveyors Group, noted that government departments, private consultants, contractors and developers had been offering structured, two-year graduate training programs for fresh graduates. After rotations and crossdepartmental training, trainees may go for professional examination and seek qualification.

Sr Steven Tang Chi-kin, Chairman of the HKIS Board of Education, stated that the surveying industry promised stability and clear career paths. "In the past three decades, even during occasional economic downturn, the market demand for surveyors has remained strong and there has always been full employment. Young and qualified surveyors, with merely three years' experience, get promoted quickly with attractive salaries. The talent loss is mainly due to falling birth rate. Also, it has now become a global trend that some members of the younger generation may take breaks between jobs or prefer part-time jobs, which may contribute to the shortage."

In 2022/2023, Hong Kong's surveying degree programmes offer around 500 places . In recent years, there has been an increase in master's and bachelor's programmes recognised by the HKIS. These, in addition to surveyingrelated associate degree and higher diploma programmes, result in approximately 900 graduates every year. Please note that most of the associate degree and higher diploma graduates continue their full-time studies immediately after graduation, and as such, the total number of graduates available in the market is actually smaller than 900. This has not even taken into account the further reduction in the number because not all graduates pursue their career in surveying.

Attractive opportunities in Hong Kong and on the mainland

Opportunities in the Greater Bay Area provide further incentives for the younger generation to pursue surveying. New measures have been announced under the Interim Guidelines for the Management of Hong Kong Engineering Construction Consultant Enterprises and Professionals Starting Business and Practising in the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area Cities. Hong Kong enterprises and professionals, including surveyors (Quantity Surveyors, Building Surveyors and General Practice Surveyors) registered with the Surveyors Registration Board, can simply register online in order to practise in the nine cities in the Area.

Since many Hong Kong developers have large projects in Qianhai, Guangzhou and Zhongshan, this measure is particularly appealing. The collaborations in the Greater Bay Area are evidenced by two recent projects in Qianhai



which have used bidding processes based on Hong Kong's practices on quantity surveying for engaging Hong Kong quantity surveying firms to provide cost management of the construction of two local schools.

Institutional efforts to attract and retain talents

To encourage students in their pursuit of surveying, the HKIS has been organising career talks at secondary schools and tertiary institutions. The Create Your District Competition, relaunched after Covid, gives secondary school students the chance to learn about the surveying profession and city development via innovative onsite activities and explorations at specific districts in Hong Kong.

The Institute and its Building Surveying Division and Quantity Surveying Division have also been offering scholarship programmes to introduce secondary school students to the profession. Sr Chan remarked, "The Building Surveying Division for instance, offers scholarships that invite secondary schools to nominate student candidates. During the scholarship application process, candidates would prepare essays, videos or presentations on surveying-related topics and to be interviewed by a panel of surveyors. After stringent assessments, the awardees will be awarded in three stages: at the initial round after showing interest in surveying, upon enrolment in a surveying programme in a tertiary institution, and upon gualification."

To help alleviate the talent drain in surveying, the Institute has given five recommendations to the government. HKIS President Sr Wong said, "Firstly, the government may introduce policies to increase the number of places for surveying programmes in UGC-funded universities including HKU, CityU and PolyU, since these universities are usually less eager to expand non-research-oriented programs such as surveying. The government may also allocate resources and subsidies to non-UGC-funded

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tertiary institutions such as THEi and PolyU SPEED, with levels close to those for UGC-funded universities."

Secondly, the government may subsidize onthe-job training provided by private firms. It was announced in the Budget 2023/2024 that the government would launch a two-year pilot scheme and allocate HKD \$100 million for on-the-job training in relation to part-time construction-related degree programmes.

Thirdly, the government may introduce measures to simplify approval procedures about planning, lease modifications/ land exchange, building plans and building permits etc, which currently involve lengthy processes of various departments with duplicated studies, varying application periods, focus on minute details etc, taking as long as 10 years. The Institute thus suggests and supports that (i) statutory procedures be streamlined and shortened; (ii) repetition of similar procedures be avoided; (iii) specific departments be authorised to simultaneously implement different procedures; (iv) relevant arrangements be streamlined; and (v) procedures be streamlined to effectively use public resources.

With the launch of the Development Projects Facilitation Office under the Development Bureau, it is expected that applications for large-scale development projects with over 500 private residential units will be followed up by designated government units to facilitate smooth approval processes.

Fourthly, technology can reduce labour needed and improve safety standards. "The MiC technology, partly implemented in controlled production environment, helps raise standards and efficiency, reduce reliance on local labour, shorten construction time, lessen environmental impact, and protect workers from adverse conditions on construction sites. MiC thus helps to enhance the image of the industry and attract young people to the profession," noted Sr Wong. Common Data Environment (CDE), Building Information Modelling (BIM), Geographic Information System (GIS) and Modular Integrated Construction (MiC) are innovative technologies to increase efficiency, and among them MiC is the main component of light public housing. However, there is an inadequate supply of surveyors who master these technologies. It is recommended that surveying programmes in tertiary institutions incorporate relevant knowledge and training.

Sr Chan noted, "Artificial Intelligence is a tool to help surveyors do basic calculations and thus enhance efficiency, stability and reduce cost. Al cannot replace surveyors' professional judgement. For instance, whereas Al drone inspections now provide auto-generated reports including scanned pictures and analyses about conditions of façade such as leakage and ageing to facilitate façade monitoring and streamline day-to-day work, surveyors still need to vet the reports and make judgements."

"Technologies have improved site safety. Via the government's Pay-For-Safety Scheme (PFSS), contractors can be reimbursed for implementing safety procedures and facilities. New technologies such as smart CCTV, smart watches and smart helmets etc, would emit alarm to alert workers when they pass through dangerous zones," Sr Chan continued.

Fifthly, the government may encourage overseas and mainland professionals to work in Hong Kong. Whereas the Budget provides for a revised Talent List to draw professionals to Hong Kong, the Institute recommends that the Labour and Welfare Bureau consider specifying places for construction and surveying talents.

"The surveying profession offers growing opportunities, stability as well as career prospects. The six surveying divisions, with critical roles in various functions prior to and after completion of construction projects, attract young people with different areas of interests," remarked Sr Wong.

解決人才短缺問題

對香港土地及房屋發展起著關鍵作用的測量行業, 近年出現人才荒的情況。隨著明日大嶼、北部都會 區以及其他主要道路和鐵路計劃陸續啟動,對測量 師將持續有龐大的需求。為了防止人才繼續供不應 求,香港測量師學會正設法吸引並挽留業界人才, 同時借助科技以減低人手需求。

學會會長黃國良測量師指出:「根據建造業議會的 建造業人力預測報告,預計跟地產及建造相關的 建築、測量及工程服務專業人才的供求差異,將由 2023年的4,000人增加至2027年的6,500人。預 測在2021/2022至2030/2031這十年的工程量,每 年將會超過3,000億港元。」

黃會長續指:「每年測量系畢業生幾乎都是百分百 就業。隨著資深測量師退休和部分測量師移民,加 上大型建設項目上馬,人手荒恐怕會愈演愈烈。如 未能解決人才供應短缺,對解決香港房屋與土地問 題定必有影響。」可行解決方案聚焦兩大方向:吸 引測量業的人才,以及尋找替代方法減省人手。

經濟下行依然全員就業

測量業是一個非常吸引的行業。畢業生在考牌前的 見習階段,起薪點月薪約為 \$18,000 至 \$25,000, 普遍薪酬每年升幅達 10% 甚至 30%,尤以今年為 甚。根據政府的薪級表,屬香港測量師學會轄下專 業會員的工料測量師、產業測量師和土地測量師, 並擁有最少考牌後一年經驗者,月薪可達 \$60,000 至 \$110,000 或以上。

黃會長表示:「測量師是土地開發、房地產發展及 建築工程的專家,和市民大眾的住屋問題、工作地 點、甚至消閒等日常生活息息相關。在興建過程中 的不同階段,測量師肩負起測繪地界、規劃發展、 工程監管、成本管理、房地產投資、物業管理、樓 宇保養等一環扣一環的工作,角色可謂舉足輕重。」

學會青年組副主席陳悦敏測量師稱,政府部門、顧 問公司、承建商和發展商均有為畢業生設立為期兩 年、有系統的在職培訓計劃。經過不同崗位輪換及 跨部門培訓,見習生就可投考專業評核試,正式考 取專業資格。

學會教育委員會主席唐致乾測量師提到,測量行業 提供了穩定的工作和清晰的職涯規劃。「在過往的 30年,即使香港偶爾遇上經濟不景,測量師依然有 很大的市場需求,不愁就業。年輕而具專業資格的 測量師,即使只有三年經驗,也很快獲得晉升機會, 薪酬吸引。人手流失主要因為生育率下降。此外, 部分年輕人可能於轉換工作期間休息、或選擇半職 工作,為近年全球一個趨勢,可能造成人手短缺。」

香港在 2022/2023 年度提供約 500 個測量學學士學 位。近年,香港測量師學會認可的碩士和學士課程 均有增加,加上測量相關的副學士及高級文憑課程, 每年為業界培訓約 900 名畢業生。由於大部分副學 士及高級文憑課程畢業生於畢業後即時繼續修讀全 日制課程,因此市場上畢業生總數比 900 為低。另 外,有少數畢業生可能選擇投身其他行業,以致測 量人才數目再略低一點。

香港及內地的優秀機遇

大灣區進一步提供更多新措施吸引年輕測量師前往 發展,如實施《香港工程建設諮詢企業和專業人士 在粵港澳大灣區內地城市開業執業試點管理暫行辦 法》,讓香港企業和專業人士,包括已於測量師註 冊管理局註冊的專業測量師(工料測量師、建築測 量師及產業測量師),只要於網上登記便能於大灣 區九個城市執業。

不少香港發展商在前海、廣州和中山均有大型項目, 令以上新措施顯得非常吸引。最近前海提供港式招 標模式,採用香港工料測量師行負責工程造價管理 興建當地兩所學校,是眾多大灣區合作項目之一。

學會積極吸納和挽留人才

香港測量師學會經常籌辦中學與大專院校的職業講 座,鼓勵同學投身測量業。此外,學會在新冠疫情 後重辦構建「你」想地區發展創作比賽,讓中學生

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藉著創意活動和探索香港各區,學習測量專業與城 市發展的相關知識。

學會及其建築測量組和工料測量組亦為中學生提供 獎學金,吸引他們加入測量專業。陳悦敏測量師補 充:「以學會的建築測量組為例,建築測量組提供 獎學金,邀請各中學提名候選學生。遴選過程會要 求申請人撰寫與測量相關的文章、製作短片和準備 簡報,並由專業測量師組成的評審團進行面試。通 過嚴謹的評核後,獲獎者將會在三個階段得到獎勵: 開始對測量行業表示興趣之時,在大專院校入讀測 量系時,以及取得測量專業資格的時候。」

為紓緩測量業人才荒帶來的影響,學會向政府提出 了五項建議。黃會長説:「第一,由於大學教育資 助委員會資助之大學(如香港大學、城市大學和理 工大學)較少主動擴充測量學等非以研究為本的學 科,政府可以推出政策增加測量學系的學額。至於 非教資會資助的院校(如香港高等教育科技學院、 香港理工大學專業進修學院),當局也可分配與教 資會資助大學相約的資源或補貼。」

第二,建議政府資助私營企業提供在職培訓。當局 已於 2023-2024 年度財政預算案宣佈推行兩年先導 計劃和撥款港幣一億元,為就讀建造業相關的兼讀 制學位課程學員提供在職培訓津貼。

第三,政府可精簡現時冗長的發展審批申請程序, 包括規劃、契約修訂/換地及建築圖則及建築許可 等申請。現時的審批過程通常是跨部門的工作,部 分研究需要重複進行,申請時間亦有所不同,有時 更着眼無關宏旨的細節等,以致發展項目由規劃到 落成可能需時10年之久。學會建議及支持(i)精 簡和縮短法定程序;(ii)避免重複執行性質相近 的程序;(iii)明確授權部門同步進行某些程序; (iv)理順相關安排;以及(v)精簡各項程序以更 有效運用公共資源。

政府現於發展局下設立項目促進辦事處,由專責的 政府單位跟進可提供 500 個或以上私人住宅單位的 申請,確保審批流程暢順。

第四,利用創新建築技術減省人手和提高安全標準。 黃會長稱:「採用『先裝後嵌』概念的組裝合成建築 法(MiC),將建築工序轉移至受控的生產環境進行, 不僅有助提高質素和效率、減低對本地建造業人手的 依賴、縮短施工時間,更造就可持續建築環境、保障 工人免受工地惡劣環境影響。因此,組裝合成建築法 可提升行業形象,吸引更多年輕人入行。」

綜合數碼共用平台(CDE)、建築資訊模型(BIM)、 地理資訊系統(GIS)、組裝合成建築法(MiC)均 為提升建築效益的創新科技,當中組裝合成建築法 是建造簡約公屋不可或缺的技術。然而本港懂得運 用這些創新技術的測量師仍然為數不多,學會建議 院校測量課程增加有關知識與培訓。

陳悦敏測量師表示:「人工智能是協助測量師做基 本運算的工具,可提升效率與穩定性,和減低成本。 人工智能卻並不能取代測量師的專業判斷。舉例說, 雖然現時無人機勘測已可提供自動分析報告,包括 掃瞄相片及分析樓宇表面的滲漏和老化問題,提升 了日常監測工作效率,但測量師仍需審閱報告和作 出判斷。」

她續稱:「科技改善了工地的安全。透過政府的安 全支付計劃(PFSS),承建商落實執行工地安全措 施項目後,政府便會支付獎勵。創新技術如智能閉 路電視、智能手錶、智能頭盔等等,在工友們經過 工地中的危險區域時,響鬧裝置會響號以發出警告 提示。」

第五,當局可加強鼓勵海外及內地測量專才來港就 業。在財政預算案現正更新的人才清單上,學會建 議勞工及福利局積極考慮增加建築及測量專才,以 反映日益增長的需求。

黃會長補充指:「測量專業晉升機會多,工作穩定, 事業前景光明。六個組別的測量師都會參與不同發 展項目的工作,在建築項目落成前後不同階段各司 其職,在各自專長範疇發揮重要功能,這些正好吸 引年青人就各自的興趣投身測量專業。」

像造汽车一样建房子! BIM 技术贯穿 全过程,这个项目建设周期将大幅压缩



为推进建筑业高质量发展,4 月 14 日,"广东省智 能建造与建筑工业化协同发展项目现场观摩会"在深 圳龙华樟坑径地块项目举办,观摩会由省住房城乡建 设厅主办。

全国建造速度最快的高层保障性住房项目将诞生

龙华樟坑径地块项目总用地面积为 3.5 万平方米,其 中一期占地 2.43 万平方米,建筑面积 17.3 万平方米, 规划 5 栋 28 层、99.7 米高的人才保障房,预计提供 2740 套租赁住房。

该项目是全国首个高度近百米混凝土模块化建筑,采 用了全过程 BIM(建筑信息模型)技术应用和全生命 周期数字化交付,将 BIM 技术贯穿设计、生产、运输、 现场实施全过程,并通过智能数字化系统,融合智慧 设计、智慧生产、智慧物流及智慧运维等高新技术, 进行全生命周期智慧建造。

"项目真正实现'像造汽车一样建房子',建设周期 仅为传统建造方式的 1/3,可实现 1 年快速交付、节 省 70% 以上现场用工量、减少 75% 以上的建筑废弃 物。"该项目现场负责人介绍,项目建成后将成为全 国第一个混凝土模块化高层建筑、全国建造速度最快 的高层保障性住房项目以及全国第一个 BIM 全生命周 期数字化交付模块化建筑项目。 观摩会上,参会人员就广东省智能建造与建筑工业化 协同发展进行深入交流,并详细参观了项目智慧建造 指挥中心、新型建筑工业化展厅及模块样板间等,深 入施工现场实地观摩项目作业情况,身临其境体会到 智能建造技术和模块化建造技术在快速建造、优质建 造等方面的优势。

继续坚持智能建造和建筑工业化协同发展

立足新发展阶段,发展智能建造不仅是城乡建设绿色 发展和建筑业数字化转型的重要抓手之一,也是新一 代信息技术与实体经济深度融合的重要阵地,更是有 效拉动内需、推动形成新发展格局的重要举措。

按住建部关于发展智能建造的工作部署,广东将"推动智能建造"纳入系列政策文件中并通过采取系列有效举措,使智能建造与建筑工业化协同发展取得可喜进展。

当前,广州、深圳、佛山入选全国智能建造试点城市; 广州、深圳、佛山、珠海、东莞、云浮等市培育打造 了一批全国和省级智能建造试点项目、典型案例及智 能建造新技术新产品创新服务范例,数字设计、智能 生产、智慧施工、产业互联网、建筑机器人、智慧运 维等智能建造全产业链多元化发展路径已在广东呈现 齐头并进态势,智能建造技术体系初见端倪。

比如在深圳,除了智能建造的最新成果——龙华樟坑 径项目外,还有腾讯云微瓴平台、大疆无人机应用等 8项技术,以及 BIM 云协同、AI 审图等 21 项技术分 别列入住建部、省住房城乡建设厅的智能建造新技术 新产品创新服务典型案例,长圳公共住房项目列入了 住建部首批7个智能建造试点项目,探索发现了一批 可复制可推广的经验做法。

会议要求,各地市要综合运用政策引导、项目带动、 产业支撑、市场培育、创新驱动及资金激励等举措, 加快推动智能建造在工程建设各环节的广泛应用。全 省各骨干建筑业企业要以数字化、智能化升级为动 力,积极与高校、研发机构协同合作,加大智能建造 技术的研发投入,合力突破核心技术,并藉助物联 网、大数据、BIM等先进的信息技术,推进智能建造 在工程建设项目的应用。各地建筑业行业协会要高度 重视智能建造与建筑工业化协同发展,在评优评先、 创建优质工程等方面大力支持智能建造技术应用工程 项目。

深圳市龙华樟坑径地块项目简介



一、基本情况

深圳市龙华樟坑径地块项目是国内首个高度近百米采 用模块化建造的保障性住房项目,项目位于深圳市龙 华区樟坑径地块,总用地面积为 3.5 万平方米,其中 一期占地 2.43 万平方米,建筑面积 17.3 万平方米。 用地首期规划 5 栋 28 层、99.7 米高的人才保障房, 预计提供 2740 套租赁住房,由 6028 个混凝土模块 单元组成。

该项目由深圳市人才安居集团有限公司规划建设,中国建筑国际集团有限公司旗下中建海龙科技有限公司 及中海建筑有限公司作为 EPC 总承包单位。

项目采用智能建造方式打造,融合了混凝土模块化建筑技术体系、屋顶机电房 DFMA 快建体系、装配式地下室等技术体系,采用数字技术打通项目的设计、生产、施工以及数字交付等各环节。

项目可实现快速交付,建设周期仅为传统建造方式的 三分之一。该项目自 2022 年 6 月 28 日 EPC 单位正 式进场至今,设计方面全过程正向 BIM 设计成果及 施工图已全部完成;现场方面,自开工以来 120 天, 便已完成全部基坑支护、土石方及桩基础工程,首栋 结构已完成至塔楼二层,10月开始首个模块化建筑 吊装施工,计划于2023年4月完成塔楼结构封顶, 2023年6底完工交付。

项目建成后将实现"三个"第一:

- 全国第一个混凝土模块化高层建筑;
- 全国建造速度最快的高层保障性住房项目;
- 全国第一个 BIM 全生命周期数字化交付模块化建筑项目。

二、技术亮点

(一)快速建造

龙华樟坑径地块项目建造工期不到1年,而按照传统 建造方式则需要两到三年完成,主要得益于采用了混 凝土模块化建筑技术体系、屋顶机电房 DfMA 快建体 系、装配式地下室等技术体系应用。

- 混凝土模块化建筑技术体系:该项目结构受力体 系采用现浇混凝土剪力墙结构,结合混凝土模块 化建筑技术应用,一个个大型的建造模块在工厂 进行预制生产,运输至现场直接吊装,大大减少 现场施工作业工期。
- 装配式地下室技术体系:灵活采用预制高性能承 台模壳、全预制框架结构、双面预制迭合挡土墙 等技术。地下室部分标准跨采用预制框架柱+预 制主梁+预制次梁+钢筋桁架楼承板;预制框架 采用灌浆套筒连接、梁柱节点核心区现浇;预制 梁采用迭合梁,主次梁连接采用牛担板形式;楼 板采用钢筋桁架楼承板。
- 屋顶机电房 DfMA 快建体系:是指在产品设计 阶段,充分考虑产品制造和装配的要求,使得 产品具有很好的可制造性和可装配性。本项目地 下室机房、公区管线、屋面机房均采用工厂预制 DFMA 模块。

(二)智能建造

- 设计阶段,深度应用 BIM 正向设计与全专业深化 前置,使建筑、结构、设备、内装等各专业紧密 配合。
- 生产运输阶段,应用工厂生产管理系统(MES) 及北斗卫星导航系统,可实现模块生产进度可视 化、货车运输进度和精准在途管理等功能。

现场施工阶段,可运用 BIM 技术分析现场交通流 线、模拟施工进度、模拟吊装工序,确保进度、 质量及安全,实现基于混凝土模块化建筑装配式 施工的智慧施工全过程管理。

 运维阶段,项目将完善工程建设数字化成果交 付、审查和存档管理体系,支撑对接城市信息模 型(CIM)基础平台,探索大数据辅助决策和监 管机制。

(三) 綠色低碳

通过模块化建筑技术体系, 龙华樟坑径地块项目将打造绿色示范工程:预计单位面积建筑废弃物产生量不高于 150吨/万平方米,相比传统建造模式减少 75%以上;材料损耗相对传统建造模式预计减少约 25%;碳排放强度相对基准建筑减排率预计 25%以上;污水排放 100%达标;能耗相对国家标准预计减少 30%以上。

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


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樂齡俱樂部: 草地滾球體驗日

活動於紀利華木球會室內草地滾球場舉行,大會 很榮幸邀得易蔭華先生擔任是次活動的主教練。 他先向各位參加者介紹草地滾球的歷史、基本玩 法及規則,並帶領參加者進行熱身及示範正確的 發球動作。



其後各參加者分成不同小組,繼續接受教練的指 導,包括練習發球動作、認識滾球的獨特設計以 及「正手」、「反手」的概念等。

經一輪練習後,學員已經可以掌握基本的動作,並 可在正式比賽線路上進行發球及比賽,他們嘗試控 制發球力度及角度,把球盡量靠近「目標球」。



教練們表示,由於草地滾球並非一個完全的圓球 體,因此其滾動路徑不會是一條直線,而是一條 帶弧度的路徑,再加上每個場地在材料和設計上 均有些微的差異,運動員需要掌握滾球的走向及 距離,十分講求發球時弧度與力度的控制與協調 技巧。另外,草地滾球屬低強度及低衝擊性運動, 可運用到全身肌肉,除了老少咸宜,也適合傷健 人士定期進行,以作鍛煉。

會員參加了是次體驗活動後,均覺得草地滾球運動是一樣「易學難精」的運動,除了能訓練手眼協調和各組肌肉外,亦需要運用腦筋計算球的走向及比賽的佈局,十分適合樂齡人士參與。而發球時為了能準確控制投放動作,更需要保持心境平靜,對一向生活節奏急促的香港人是一個很好的心境調節訓練。

各位參加者在活動完結後便到會所餐廳與教練一 同享用午餐,增進彼此友誼及聯繫。

The BSD was delighted to arrange a short course on building components and materials as a one-weekday seminar and half-day weekend visit by inviting heating, ventilation, and airconditioning (HVAC) specialists Mr PL Ho and Mr Jackson Chack to address its members.


Mr Ho gave the seminar on plate-tube evaporative condensed chillers, which use the latest evaporative condensing technology to directly cool a chiller refrigerant and is a highly energy-efficient alternative to air and water-cooled condensed chillers. Then, he demonstrated its practical operation when BSD members visited the PMS showroom on 15 April. Mr Chack then demonstrated the way in which a fan coil unit could achieve energy savings.

The CPD certainly benefited all members from the design, operations, and maintenance perspectives.



Architectural Glass: from Safety to Sustainability (28 April 2023)


Three speakers from Hong Kong, Germany, and Finland collectively delivered a CPD on glass to members.

Christoph Troska from Germany then shared how the design of and consideration behind the glass product meets environmentally friendly, long-term vision, and animal-friendly criteria, as well as resolves challenges. Finally, Riku Färm from Finland explained the distortions and anisotropy in tempered glass and the factors that affect end glass product quality.

GPD Visit to the Greater Bay Area (產業測量組 廣東省大灣區考察團)

In January, the GPD Council arranged a trip to several Mainland cities in the Greater Bay Area in anticipation of the border's reopening.

I am pleased to report that the study tour from 6-8 April was a great success for 23 participants.

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Since the pandemic had prevented travel to China for the past three years, the trip was particularly meaningful for the participants, who were the first surveyors to witness the remarkable and rapid developments across the border since the pandemic began.

It was truly an amazing experience to exchange views face-to-face with representatives of the Administrative Bureau of the Qianhai Shenzhen-Hong Kong Modern Service Industry Cooperation Zone (深圳市前海深港現代服務業合作區管理局). Members had the opportunity to discuss the arrangements for surveyor practice registration and encourage policies for youth development.

Members were also delighted to have in-depth conversations on professional topics, including rights renewal of non-residential properties and policies on affordable housing, with representatives of the Department of Housing and Urban Rural Development of Guangdong Province (廣東省住房和城鄉建設廳).

Additionally, they had fruitful discussions with representatives of the Shenzhen Association of Real Estate Appraisers (深圳市不動產估價協會), which enlightened them on the recent developments in Shenzhen's valuation industry and encouraged collaboration between valuers in Hong Kong and Shenzhen.

Finally, members toured the facilities of XPENG Motors at the Guangzhou Higher Education and BeiGene Bioisland Innovation Centers in Guangzhou, which allowed them to learn about the most recent advancements in the biotechnology and flying automobile sectors. The delegation also spent that morning seeing TaikooHui in Guangzhou, a prominent commercial building that features several ESG invitations.

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GPD Visit to the Greater Bay Area

Public Forums: Updating and Streamlining the Compulsory Sale Regime under the Land (Compulsory Sale for Redevelopment) Ordinance (Cap 545)

Given Hong Kong's rapidly ageing building stock, there is an imminent need to adopt more effective policy measures to expedite redevelopment and improve the urban living environment. To this end, DevB is reviewing the compulsory sale regime under the Land (Compulsory Sale for Redevelopment) Ordinance (Cap 545).

On 22 November 2022, DevB briefed the Legislative Council Panel on Development on the following proposed measures to update and streamline the compulsory sale regime in the following four ways:

- (1) Lowering the thresholds for compulsory sale applications
- (2) Allowing more flexibility for multiple adjoining lot compulsory sale applications
- (3) Improving the clarity and streamlining the legal process of the compulsory sale regime
- (4) Enhancing support to minority owners affected by compulsory sale applications

Create Your District Competition is Back!

I am pleased to inform members that the Create Your District Competition (CYD) is back this year after a three-year hiatus. This is one of the HKIS's flagship annual activities to promote six disciplines of the surveying profession to students.

Along with fellow member Sr Jacqueline Kwok, I sat on the CYD 2023 Organising Committee (OC) on behalf of the LSD. For previous competitions since 2017, most teams submitted either physical 3D models or multimedia videos for their entries, although Story Map could be submitted on a voluntary basis. This year, the OC adopted Story Map as the required format for all entries because it integrates the 3D models and videos. The objective is to familiarise the students with the use and application of GIS technology, which is a specialised field for land surveyors and employs open geospatial data available in CSDI. Story Map and GIS training will be provided to all participating teams in GeoLab.

This year's CYD will focus on the Northern Metropolis. It will encourage students to explore the area's history, cultural traditions, and development, as well as educate them on the importance of sustainable development. The students can then demonstrate their creativity by designing their ideal communities in the Northern Metropolis.

"Use of BIM in the Cross Bay Link Project"

On 27 April, LSD Council Member Sr Peter WONG delivered a CPD on the use of BIM in the Cross Bay Link Project. He highlighted the coordination and managing role of land surveyors in the project's BIM journey. LSD Vice Chairman Sr CK LAU welcomed the speaker and audience and presented a certificate of appreciation to Peter after the talk.




Peter opened the talk by introducing the characteristics of the New Engineering Contract (NEC) and the benefits of using BIM across a project's life cycle. He also introduced the common data environment (CDE) platform used in the Cross Bay Link project.

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Later, Peter shared various cases to demonstrate how the BIM coordinated by land surveyors can facilitate project implementation and provide a clearer and more accurate view of a construction project's progress, those works that stand out, auditor checks, etc.



Advantages of BIM In Design Stage

- Visualize the whole design easily.
- More effective in the cost estimation.
- Discover and avoid clashes before construction.
- Reduce RFI percentage.



Peter ended his presentation by discussing the role of land surveyors during the BIM maintenance stage of a project. He highlighted the importance of "coordinates," – the "northing, easting, height" – in the BIM coordination throughout the Cross Bay Link project's life cycle.

Energy Conservation and Green Preservation

I was invited to a seminar organised by the Property Management Services Authority (PMSA) on 24 March at PolyU. The talk covered the subjects of energy conservation, carbon reduction, tree planting, and green preservation in private properties, in which property management (PM) practitioners play an important role.

Ms Quince Chong, Chief Corporate Development Officer of CLP Power Hong Kong, Ltd, explained how CLP supported the sustainability efforts of property management companies (PMCs). PMSA Chairperson Dr James Wong highlighted the responsibility of PM practitioners to protect the environment by adopting sustainable practices. He also vowed that the PMSA would actively incorporate an environmental, social, and governance (ESG) framework into future PM industry developments.

CLP agreed to provide professional advice on saving energy and funding to subsidise improvements with a view to promoting a

zero carbon policy in the long run. As for tree management, PM companies would benefit from the guidelines and handbooks on assessing tree risks and maintenance, as well as useful information on any tree's history and its liabilities on the Development Bureau's website.

The seminar was well-received the over 250 members in attendance, each of whom earned two CPD participation hours under the PMSA's CPD scheme and will be awarded certificates of participation by the PMSA.


BIM Application in Property and Construction Management


Mr Simon Ng, Head of BIM-China State Construction Engineering (Hong Kong), Ltd, was invited to give a talk on the abovecaptioned topic on 26 October 2022.

The talk began with an introductory session on BIM development in construction projects and those projects that utilised full BIM models. Mr Ng then introduced BIM through a project life cycle model, which demonstrated BIM's various dimensions (Figure 1) including FM platform integration and life cycle modelling.

Later, Mr Ng presented examples of BIM functions and how BIM supported 4D construction simulation, automatic drawing generation, 3D design reviews and coordination, 5D quantity takeoff and digital surveying, etc. He also introduced an online platform for BIM models that construction professionals could consult to support their work.



In part two of the CPD, Mr Ng explained "8 Things You Should Know about BIM" (Figure 2), which included some major principles that explained what BIM was about and its application. He concluded with a discussion on the future of BIM, which mentioned the Government's plans for it such as including BIM models in tender information, introducing the concept ahead of the digital construction and industrialisation stages, and forming a smart city supply chain as part of future developments.



In closing, Mr Ng explained the factors behind the successful implementation of BIM including timing, project team effort, support from management, policy, incentive, and training. All project teams should be supported by their BIM teams, along with BIM ecosystem and technological support, to make the projects work.

During the Q&A session, Mr Ng responded to several queries from delegates on the cost benefit of BIM salutations with a comparison of existing techniques. He concluded his presentation by sharing his thoughts on the challenges to further promoting BIM on a consolidated online platform.

The issue of Hong Kong's inadequate manpower supply echoes the findings of the "Survey on QS Manpower Demand and Competences of Fresh QS Grades" performed by the QSD last year. It revealed a shortage of both quantity surveying graduates and experienced quantity surveyors. 


CICES President's Visit to the HKIS (20 April 2023)

Sr Paul Wong and Sr Sunny Choi presented certificates of appreciation to Francis and Joyce at the conclusion of the CPD.






This was a joint CPD by the QSD and Hong Kong Institute of Construction Managers.

The Development Bureau promulgated Technical Circular (Works) No.6/2021 on 5 October 2021 regarding the implementation of Security of Payment Provisions (SOP Provisions) in public works contracts. The legislation of SOP is also in progress. It aims to facilitate the timely processing of payments and enable a speedier resolution of payment-related disputes

in construction projects.

SOP calls for a change in construction contract management and will likely affect most practitioners in Hong Kong's construction industry. During this CPD, Sr Eric Ting shared the key differences between SOP Provisions and SOP Legislations and advised how to strengthen construction contract management and handle payment disputes under the SOP Provisions.

Over 430 participants joined this event and they raised many questions during the subsequent Q&A session, which extended until around 9:00 pm.



Progress of the SOP Legislation

Sr Paul Wong (President of the HKIS) and Sr Raymond Kam (Honorary Secretary of the HKIS) met Mr Wong Yan Lok, Roger, JP and his team members on 18 April 2023 to express views on various provisions in the proposed SOP legislation. The latest development of the SOP legislation had been highlighted by Sr Raymond Kam to QSD Council members and members' opinions and concerns were collected for further review.

HKIS Feature Article: Case Study – Managing Relationship with Public Servants

Surveyors working in clients, consultancy firms or contractors from time to time come into contact and have interaction with public servants (i.e. including government officers, members (e.g. Board Member) and staff of public bodies) through official dealings or social activities. Though it is not uncommon in the business arena for surveyors to offer gifts or hospitality to their business counterparts to maintain good business relationship, if their counterparts are public servants, surveyors should be particularly cautious as public servants are subject to more stringent legal provisions and administrative rules on acceptance of advantages than other private business counterparts.

Cases in Perspective

<u>Case 1</u>

ABC Company was awarded with a consultancy agreement by a government department for providing surveying services for the construction of a building. Tom, a surveyor of ABC, lent his private car to an officer of the government department who was responsible for administering the consultancy agreement for the officer's private use for a week.

Case 2

XYZ Consultancy Firm was a term consultant engaged by a public body for maintenance of buildings and facilities. While having business dealings with the public body, Tony, a surveyor of XYZ, offered over a dozen boxes of mooncakes to an officer of the public body. Despite the officer's refusal to accept, he insisted and left the mooncakes in the officer's office. Legal Requirements

In accordance with Section 8 of the Prevention of Bribery Ordinance (POBO, Cap. 201), it is an offence if:

any person, without lawful authority or reasonable excuse, having any business dealings of any kind with a government department/office or a public body, offer any advantage to any prescribed officer employed in that department/office or public servant employed by that public body.

The maximum penalty for the above offence is \$500,000 fine and seven years' imprisonment.

Corruption Risk Analysis

In both cases, the lending of the car and offering of mooncakes were gifts and considered as advantages under POBO. Tom and Tony had respectively offered the advantage to the officer of the government department / public body which had a business dealing with ABC/ XYZ. Therefore, both Tom and Tony could have committed an offence under Section 8 of POBO. In case 2, Tony could be liable even when the advantage was offered without an intention for it to be a reward or an inducement for any reciprocal act by the officer and the officer did not accept the advantage.

Corruption Preventive Measures

To ensure directors, employees and agents adhere to a high standard of integrity when dealing with public servants, employers (e.g. clients, consultancy firms, contractors) should:

 Iay down policies and guidelines governing the offering of advantages and entertainment to business contacts of the organisation, especially staff of government departments and public bodies;

- put in place a system for the control, approval, documentation, monitoring and review of offering of advantages and entertainment to business contacts of the organisation;
- conduct audits/reviews of the above activities and to take appropriate actions in case of non-compliance;
- provide channels to receive feedback or reports on suspected breaches; and
- ✓ join the Construction Industry Integrity Charter 2.0 jointly launched by the Independent Commission Against Corruption, the Development Bureau and the Construction Industry Council to promote and encourage the implementation of an Integrity Management System.  ✓ strictly observe the probity requirements set out by their employers; and

✓ promptly report to ICAC when bribery is suspected.
